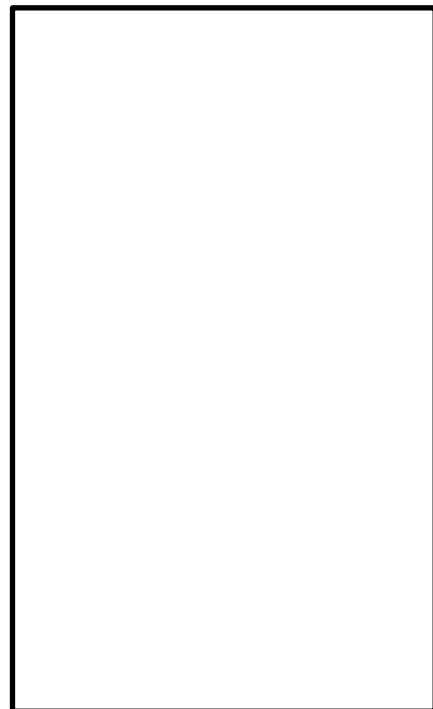
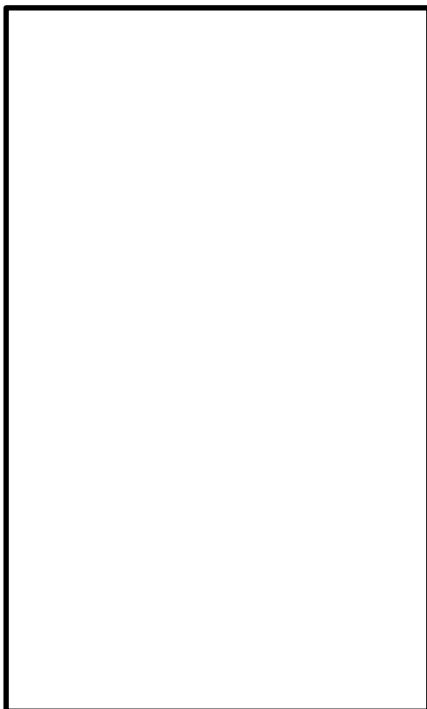

Timeline

It's time to GO LARGE.

As per the *How To* book. Go find an empty table and put masking tape along it (if it won't damage the table!)

Add POST-IT notes for the beginning, short story, and end.

Different Post-it Note sizes

2" x 1.5"

3" x 3"

Note:

I find the 2" x 1.5" more than enough for this step, and they fit on the page easier later on!

There are many other sizes too!

Add in the rest of your plot so far

Go back to Page 34. Copy all your ideas to individual post-it notes and stick them on the timeline. Add any that you have thought of since then.

Try to work out the order as you go. Perhaps you've changed your mind since you wrote them and the scenes need to be rearranged.

Some new ideas might be born during this process.

WRITE THEM DOWN NOW!

How does it look? Move them around if you need to.

Fill in the gaps with ideas as per the *How To* book.

It's time to set fire to the tree!

Then add a CLASHING COLOUR post-it note under EVERY challenge you've set your Key Characters - or Villain.

On the new colour, devise ways to disrupt or ruin that plan.

This will produce even more ideas.

WRITE THEM DOWN! :)

You're bound to have new characters and settings so we'll deal with those next.

Note: if you used Post-it notes they stick REALLY well to windows or walls!

Once you've worked out how many chapters you need (See *How To* book) You can divide them up into chapters.

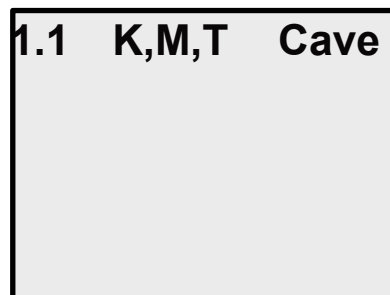
You will probably have 3 per chapter if you're following along with me.



Hint: in the top left corner (in pencil) I usually write the chapter and scene number incase they get mixed up.

Eg. 1.1 (for chapter one. scene one)

Across the top I add who is there - just initials and where the scene is taking place It doesn't have to be big, just squeeze it in the top 1/4".



Ready set go

Okay. You have your story, your characters, your settings and a wall full of post-it notes.

Transfer the post-it notes to the pages of this book (from Page 46 onwards) and you're ready to go.

When that's done

1. Look at the first chapter, and the first post-it note.

Spend five minutes dreaming through that section of plot and see what ideas you come up with.

2. Use the right hand side of the chapter-spread page to make quick notes on what you 'saw' or any ideas that need to be incorporated.

3. Break out your preferred method of writing and GO FOR IT!

Well done and remember to have FUN.
